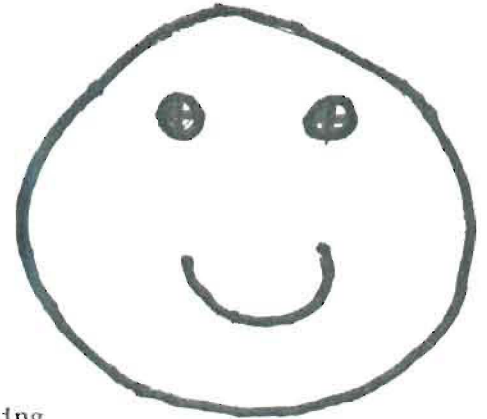
## Camper Of The Week

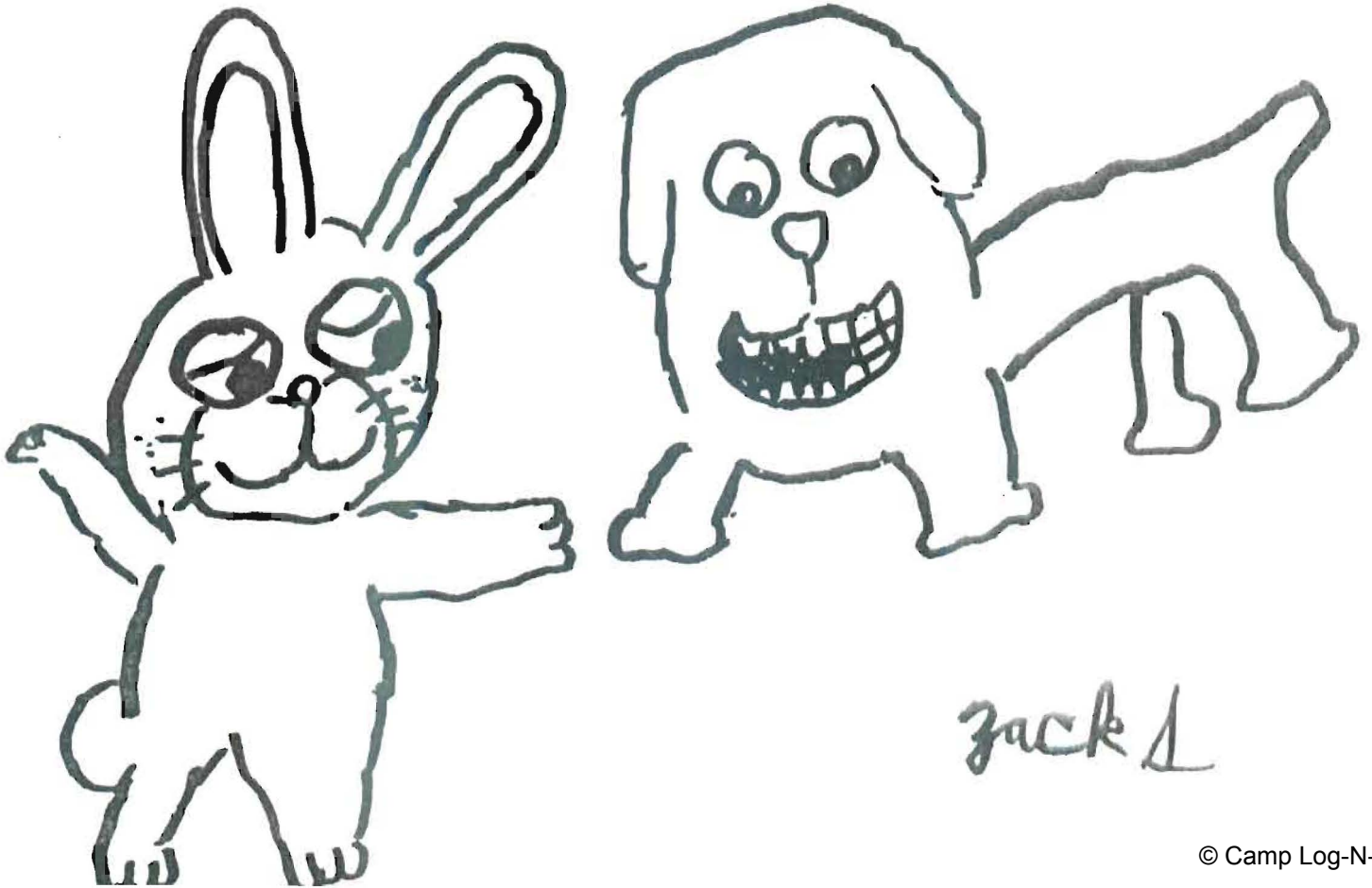
